Reducing the Line of Duty Deaths

Over the course of the last ten years, more than 150 law enforcement officers (on average) have died each year in the line of duty. Law enforcement is a dangerous profession and there will always be line-of-duty deaths at the hands of evil people. Unfortunately, too many officer deaths are due to “accidents” or otherwise preventable circumstances. In some years, the number of deaths due to accidents is actually higher than the number of deaths due to felonious assault. The Below 100 Initiative was started in 2011 with the mission of reducing line-of-duty deaths of police officers to less than 100 per year. The last time that line-of-duty deaths were below 100 was 1944. The Below 100 training courses target preventable deaths.
